

Ethics in publishing

Policy and ethics

Authors should provide a covering letter, in which they declare that the study was performed according to the international, national and institutional rules considering animal experiments, clinical studies and biodiversity rights.

Animal and clinical studies - For research using experimental animals, authors should state in the Methods section that the research was conducted in accordance with the internationally accepted principles for laboratory animal use and care as found in for example the European Community guidelines (EEC Directive of 1986; 86/609/EEC) or the US guidelines (NIH publication #85-23, revised in 1985). The studies with human must state in the Methods section that the research followed guidelines of the Declaration of Helsinki and Tokyo for humans, and was approved by the institutional human experimentation committee or equivalent, and that informed consent was obtained. The Editors of Investigational Medicinal Chemistry and

Pharmacology will reject papers if there is any doubt about the suitability of the animal or human procedures used.

Biodiversity rights - Investigations with plants needs to follow the international, national and institutional rules concerning the biodiversity rights.
